2017-2018 Program Areas

Student Success Stipends - Through the Student Success Stipends program, we offer students, who don't have the economic means or are disenfranchised due to race or family situations, opportunities to participate in learning activities. Over \$60,000 of financial assistance has been given to students in recent years. Examples include:

- Backpacks and School Supplies
- Bus Passes and Extracurricular Activity fees
- Music, Theatre and Academic Enrichment programs

Children's Food for Thought (CFT) - Children's Food for Thought is an important program that provides nourishing school lunches for our students when their families have a financial crisis. Whether the family has a temporary financial setback, doesn't qualify for federal food assistance, or is in the process of applying for aid, Children's Food for Thought is there to help.

Scholarships - The Education Foundation of Bloomington invests in our students and their post-secondary goals. We know that they are our future and the leaders of tomorrow.

Prodigy - The Education Foundation of Bloomington's Prodigy Awards recognizes superb teamwork that improves the educational environment within the Bloomington Public Schools. Nominations are submitted every year to recognize groups of staff teams or administrative teams that demonstrate outstanding teamwork.
